A Metal Magnet





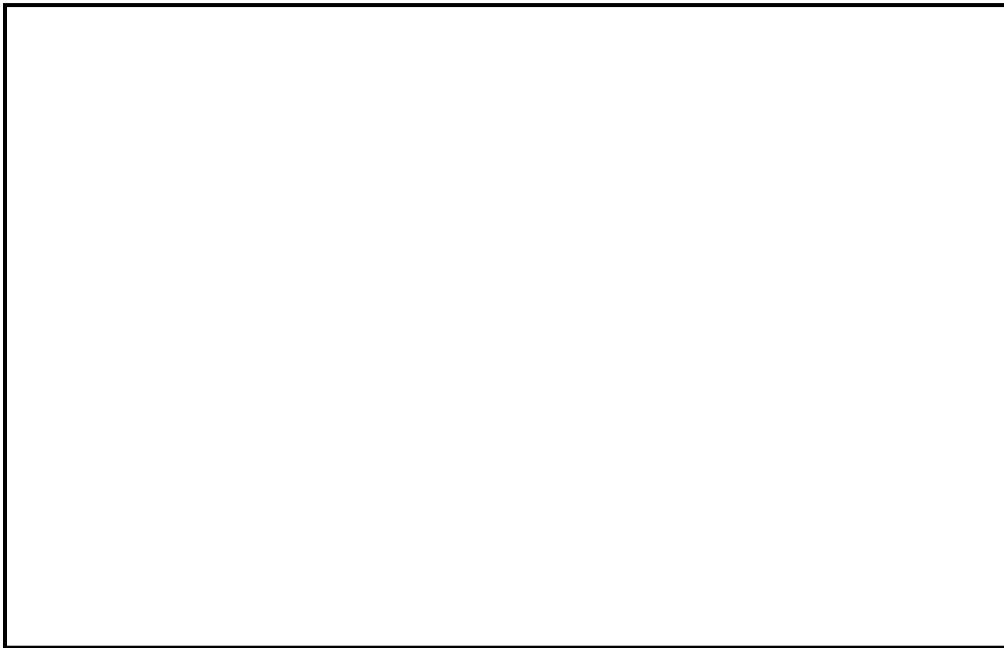
